Southern Scholarship Foundation provides **rent-free**, **cooperative living housing** for qualified incoming or current undergraduate and graduate students demonstrating academic achievement (with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA), financial need (as identified on the FAFSA), and good character. **With SSF's scholarship**, **students save an average of \$13,000 per year on the cost of living while away from home.** SSF accepts applicants in any year of their undergraduate or graduate degree programs.
